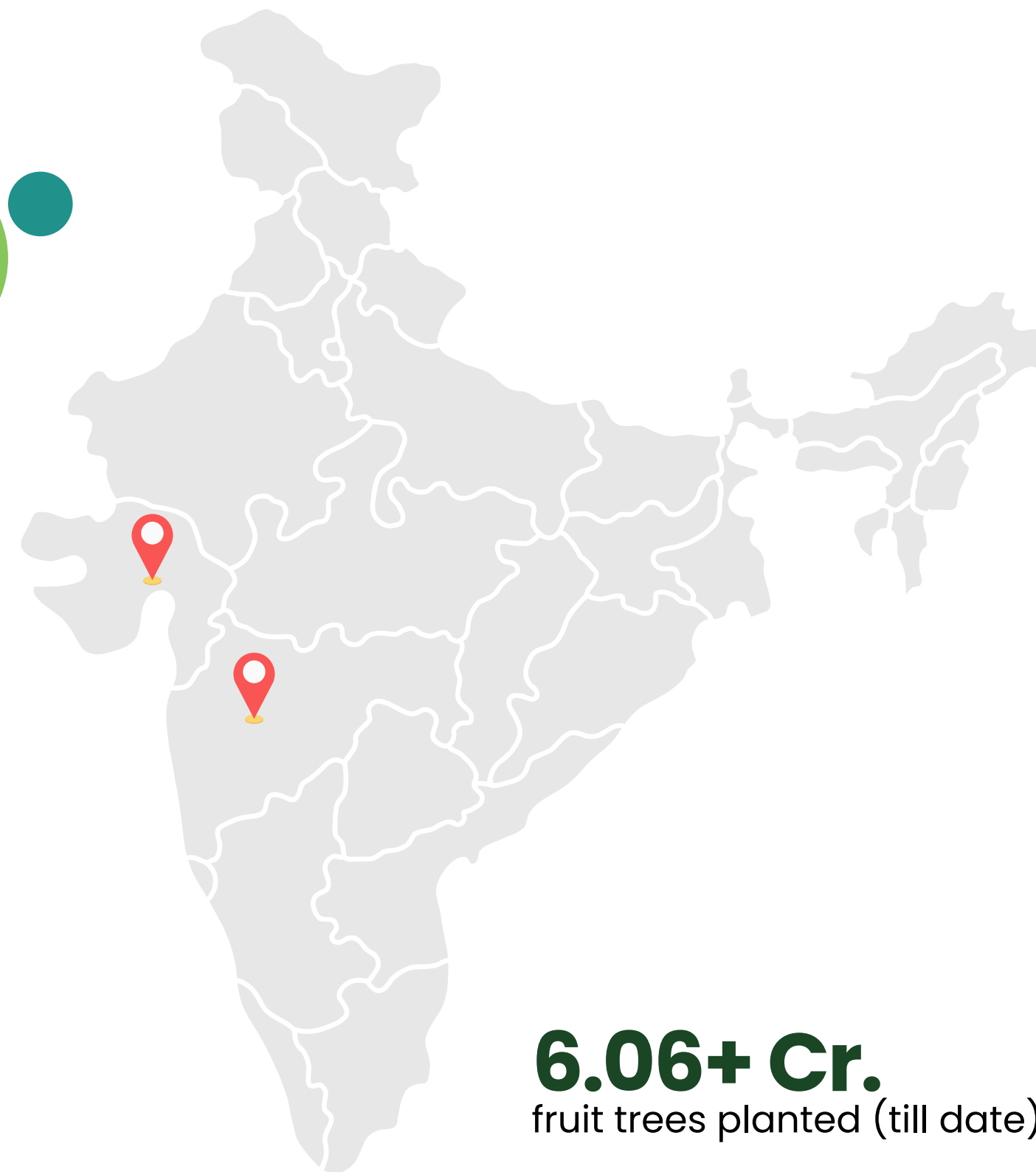

SUCCESS STORIES

NURSERY INSPECTION FOR SAPLING PROCUREMENT

Senior agronomists from GVT visited pomegranate and lemon nurseries to assess the quality and readiness of saplings for procurement. The evaluation covered multiple aspects including mother plants, nursery practices, supply capacity, sapling health, and overall management standards.

The team also gathered references of farmers who have previously planted from these nurseries and reviewed their field-level results, ensuring that only reliable and high-performing sources are considered for distribution.

SECURING WATER, EMPOWERING COMMUNITIES

In continuation of the earlier construction of 16 Global River Aquashaft (GRA) structures and one Cement Nala Bund (CNB), the foundation ceremony for the second CNB in Nipani village (Dhoki Cluster, Dharashiv) was held in the presence of the village Sarpanch and local villagers.

The initiative reflects the community's growing involvement in water conservation efforts and marks another step towards ensuring long-term water security for the region.

MANGO ORCHARD CAPACITY BUILDING

As part of its ongoing efforts to provide advanced field training, Global Vikas Trust (GVT) organized a session on “Mango Orchard Management” at Wagholi (Varuda), Dharashiv.

The training was conducted by Mr. M.B. Patil, a Horticulture expert & Former Associate Dean, College of Agriculture, Dharashiv, along with experts from Vasant Rao Naik Marathwada Agricultural University—Prof. Chavan, Prof. Waghmare, and Prof. Deshmukh—who guided farmers on land preparation, spacing, planting techniques, and nutrient and water management.

Farmers from villages like Sanja, Sarola, Balpirwadi, Tuljapur, Alni, Kajala, and Khed attended in large numbers, showing strong interest in improved orchard practices.



COLLABORATING FOR FARMER-TECH SOLUTIONS

To explore farmer-focused technological solutions, Mr. Mahesh Surve and Mr. Amar Dixit from Borosil Scientific visited GVT Krishikul. GVT agronomists shared key challenges faced by farmers and highlighted the need for affordable equipment with only essential features, as many existing tools are costly due to advanced functionalities. They also noted that while some Chinese-made instruments are useful, they often lack reliability. Borosil's support in developing practical and cost-effective alternatives could greatly benefit marginal farmers.



EMPOWERING FARMERS WITH HANDS-ON AGRICULTURAL INSIGHTS

As part of a structured exposure visit aimed at promoting practical learning and capacity building, a group of 40 farmers from the Subir Cluster in Gujarat visited GVT Krishikul. The two-day program was jointly organized by the L&T Public Charitable Trust (LTPTC) and the Aga Khan Foundation.

The visit focused on enhancing farmers' understanding of improved agricultural practices. Participants were introduced to key topics such as soil and water testing, scientific farming methods, and locally relevant techniques for sustainable cultivation. The interactive sessions offered valuable insights into practical, low-cost solutions to help improve productivity and farm resilience.

ON-GROUND REVIEW OF WATER CONSERVATION PROJECTS

As part of a project review and field assessment, Mr. Swayang Bikash Jena from the Rotary Club of Delhi Premier (RCDP) and Geologist Mr. Devendra Joshi visited several villages in Kalamb (Nipani) and Dharashiv (Waghole, Upala Makdache, Pimpri) to observe the ongoing initiatives by Global Vikas Trust (GVT).

During the visit, they interacted with Gram Panchayat members and closely inspected the water conservation structures under implementation. The visit acknowledged GVT's impactful grassroots work and reinforced the importance of collaborative efforts in driving sustainable water resource management across rural communities.



GVT ADVANCES TOWARD TECH-DRIVEN FARMING SOLUTIONS

To adopt and promote advanced farming technologies, the Global Vikas Trust (GVT) team undertook a two-day study visit focused on protected farming.

They visited KVK Baramati, RnS Polyhouse units (Baramati & Theur), and Govind Greenhouse, Talegaon, exploring AI- and IoT-based climate control systems, Indo-Dutch farming techniques, and various polyhouse models. Experts like Mr. Vasane and Mr. Gadekar shared insights on structure selection, cultivation practices, and market trends.

The team also learned about banana plant hardening, crop planning, and polyhouse cost structures. The visit concluded with actionable insights, potential collaboration opportunities, and a clear direction for conducting local farmer surveys to assess future implementation strategies.

EMPOWERING FARMERS THROUGH CONSISTENT FIELD ENGAGEMENT

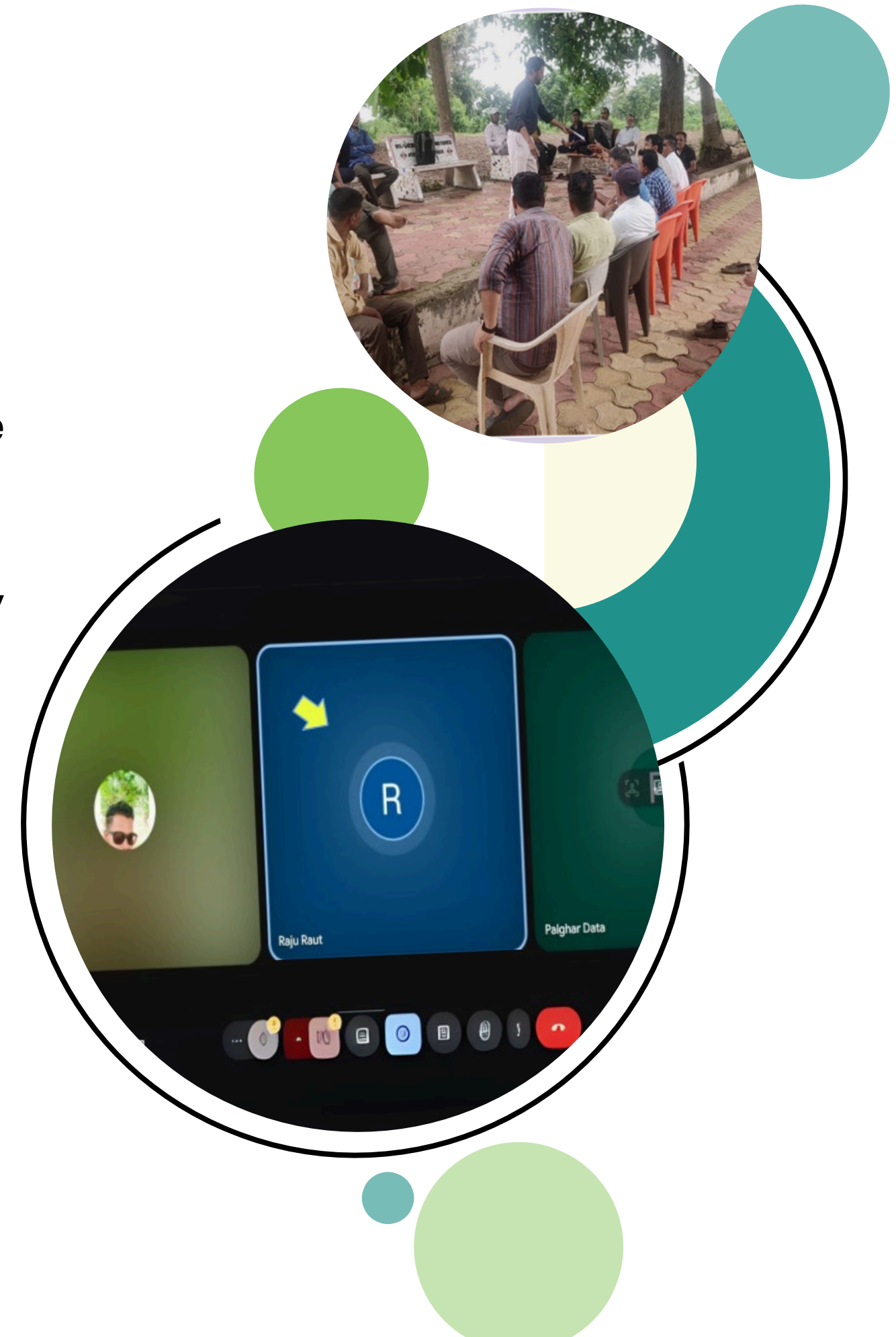
As part of Global Vikas Trust's regular engagement with farmers, regional meetings were conducted in Palghar, and Bharuch to provide timely, crop-specific guidance.
