ANNACHATRA: A STEP TOWARDS HUNGER-FREE COMMUNITIES

Many elderly people, daily wage workers, and poor families struggle to get a proper meal every day. To support such needy people and ensure that no one goes hungry, Global Vikas Trust started its free community meal service, Annachatra, in Parli and Sirsala. Through this initiative, free, nutritious, and hygienic meals are provided to people in need. Every day, Annachatra serves approximately 100–120 people in Sirsala and 150–200 people in Parli, providing them with regular meals and much-needed support. This is another step by Global Vikas Trust towards serving society and helping vulnerable communities with care and compassion. The initiative has been appreciated by residents, who believe it is bringing meaningful support and relief to many families. By serving meals to those in need, Global Vikas Trust continues its mission of improving lives and building a more caring and inclusive community.



TRAINING SESSION FOR AGRICULTURAL STUDENTS



To gain practical exposure to modern agriculture and soil management practices, students from CSMSS College, Sambhaji Nagar, Aurangabad, visited the GVT Krishikul Training Centre.

During the visit, students received hands-on training and practical demonstrations on various aspects of modern agriculture. The sessions covered topics such as scientific farming methods, soil health management, sustainable agricultural practices, water conservation, horticulture, and other field-based techniques that progressive farmers are successfully adopting.

The students actively participated by asking questions, engaging with trainers, and observing real-life agricultural models and demonstrations. The visit provided them with valuable practical knowledge, helping bridge the gap between classroom learning and field application while enhancing their understanding of current opportunities and challenges in the agricultural sector.

CAPACITY BUILDING & AWARENESS MEETING



To create awareness about livelihood and agricultural development opportunities, Global Vikas Trust interacted with local farmers during the monthly Gram Panchayat meeting held in Udhale, Mokhada Taluka.

During the session, information was shared on livelihood activities such as Mogra cultivation, Banana and Pineapple plantations, Go Krupa Amrut preparation, and Vermicompost production. Farmers showed interest in participating in the proposed activities and registration process.

Farmers also expressed the need for water conservation and watershed development initiatives to improve water availability and agricultural productivity in the area.

EXPOSURE VISIT ON ORGANIC FARMING

To promote sustainable and organic farming practices, the GVT Palghar team organised an exposure visit for members of a Women Farmer Self-Help Group affiliated with Mahila Arthik Vikas Mahamandal (MAVIM), Government of Maharashtra, at Palghar Krushikul, Ambivali (Vikramgad).

The programme provided practical knowledge on preparing organic farming inputs such as Vermicompost, Go Krupa Amrutam, and Dashparni Ark, along with a live demonstration of Dashparni Ark preparation.

The women farmers actively participated in the sessions and gained valuable insights into sustainable and cost-effective farming practices.



SERICULTURE EXPOSURE VISIT AT GVT KRISHIKUL, BEED



To enhance farmers' understanding of sericulture and promote improved farming practices, a two-day exposure visit was organised for 34 farmers from Jawhar Taluka, Palghar district, to GVT Krushikul, Parli, Beed.

During the visit, farmers received practical knowledge through field visits, demonstrations, and interactive sessions on silkworm rearing, mulberry cultivation, and sustainable farming practices.

The programme helped farmers gain better understanding of sericulture, organic farming, soil and water conservation, and other sustainable agricultural techniques.



AGRICULTURE DEPARTMENT & NGO MEETING



To strengthen farmer-focused development initiatives, the Vikramgad Taluka Agriculture Office organised a coordination meeting with NGOs working across Palghar district.

The meeting focused on sustainable agriculture, water conservation, watershed development, and rural livelihood opportunities. Representing Global Vikas Trust, Ajay Sutar shared updates on the organisation's ongoing interventions and the upcoming Farmer Training Centre aimed at promoting sustainable agricultural practices and farmer capacity-building.

EXPANDING FARMER OUTREACH THROUGH NEW CLUSTER OFFICES



ANAND (GUJARAT)



JEUR (SOLAPUR)

With continuous requests from local communities for GVT to initiate livelihood interventions in their areas, Global Vikas Trust expanded its field presence last month by establishing new cluster offices at Jeur (Solapur, Maharashtra) and Anand (Gujarat).

The decision to establish these clusters was based on field-level assessments, which identified a need to support small and marginal farmers in improving their livelihoods and farm incomes. The new clusters will serve as resource centres for promoting fruit tree plantation and other sustainable livelihood interventions in the region.

Through these centres, small and marginal farmers will have access to quality saplings at subsidized rates, training at various stages of crop and plant growth, technical guidance, and field-level support. The expansion is expected to strengthen farmer engagement, encourage the adoption of improved agricultural practices, and enable GVT to extend its services to a larger number of farming families in the region.

The establishment of these clusters marks an important step in GVT's efforts to deepen its outreach and create a wider impact on rural livelihoods across Maharashtra and Gujarat.

SUCCESS STORY - 1



Transitioning from traditional farming to Banana (Variety: G-9 Tissue) cultivation, the farmer achieved remarkable success with support from Global Vikas Trust. Through the dedicated efforts of the farmer and family, a harvest of 22,100 kg of high-quality Banana produce was achieved and sold at ₹9 per kg. This generated a gross income of ₹1.99 lakh and a net profit of ₹1.34 lakh per acre annually, reflecting the strong income potential of scientific horticulture-based farming and sustainable livelihood enhancement.

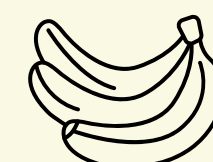

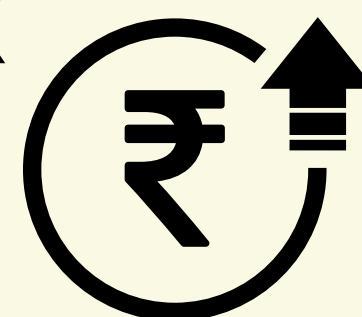

SUCCESS STORY - 2



Transitioning from traditional farming to Mulberry (Variety: V-1) cultivation, the farmer achieved remarkable success with support from Global Vikas Trust. Through dedicated efforts and improved farming practices, the farmer harvested 475 kg of high-quality silkworm cocoons, which was sold at ₹590 per kg. This generated a gross income of ₹2.80 lakh and a net profit of ₹2.12 lakh per acre annually, demonstrating the strong income potential of sericulture-based farming.

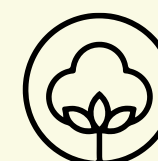

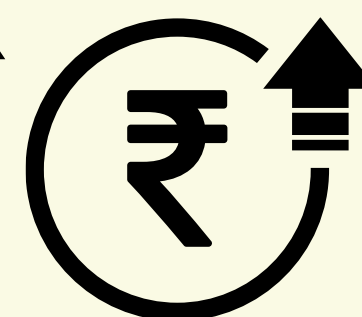
